Zakcq currently serves on the board of directors for the Citizens' Transportation Coalition, is an adjunct professor of urban planning at Texas Southern University, and is a co-founder of Social Agency Lab, a collaborative of urban planners and designers from around the country who engage in public art and creative urban interventions.
